# Minutes of AGM 2020









- Governance working group the group has been joined by Richard Thom
  (Hawarden TTC) and has been tracking our development work against our
  governance priorities and the Governance and Leadership Framework for Wales.
  An action plan has been drafted for the next 12 months.
- **Board composition-** many thanks to both Catherine Jones and Karlijn Asveld who both retired from their positions as South west Regional Director and Finance Director. Andrew Thomas joined our Board as an independent Finance Director.
- Inclusion achieved the Disability Sport Wales insport Bronze award

  was important to us as it demonstrates our commitment to ensure that table
  tennis is for everyone-inclusive thinking, planning, development and delivery by
  everyone within the NGB.

**UK Anti-Doping (UKAD) rules-** TTW adopted the 11 rules in Jan 2021.

Evidence has been submitted that we meet the relevant standards on the UKAD assurance framework (oppostite). This is a large piece of work and ranges from developing our policy, codes of conduct, training, and education plan to communications of the rule changes and demonstrating Board discussion and decision making.

The new rules include recreational athletes and protecting whistle-blowers.





### Company articles of association development-

- This governing document defines the purpose of a company, the rules and regulations, the rights of the members and the process for appointing/electing Directors.
- TTW reviewed the articles in 2019 and these changes were voted in by Voting Members at the 2019 AGM. Voting Members are clubs or leagues who have over 15 adult paying members (1 vote) or if they have 75 and over then they receive 2 votes.
- Since last year's AGM, some Voting Members have expressed dissatisfaction with the current articles and called for an Extraordinary General Meeting in February 2021 to vote on a resolution which would increase member powers.
- Based on the advice received from Sport Wales and our legal team, if these amended articles were voted through then our Sport Wales funding would be affected- this is a huge threat to the sport as Sport Wales funds 90% of our sport in 2020-2021
- The Voting Members withdrew this resolution and agreed that representatives would join a working group with to establish a mutually agreeable set of company articles.
- This process was unsuccessful and Voting Members requested another EGM in July 2021, to vote on another set of articles that they had developed independently.
- This proposal would be so detrimental to our governance that Sport Wales issued a letter saying that they would stop funding TTW if they were voted through.
- This has led to the staff team being notified at risk of redundancy in September and all international competitions
  were paused until Sport Wales clarified that they would move our payments from 6 monthly to monthly until this
  risk was managed.

Resolving this matter quickly is 'pivotal' for the future of the sport, not only in terms of funding, but also to retain quality staff and Board members who have been negatively affected by this action. It has caused significant stress and distraction to the whole organisation who are trying to build back the sport after covid-19- the timing couldn't be worse. Sport Wales grant funds the following:

- Welsh National squad developing and training the Welsh squad- achieve on the world stage
- Training and competition budget —used for camps/training costs and overseas/domestic tournament costs. This year focus on qualifying our players for next years Commonwealth Games and bringing back some of our squad to international competition.
- **Community Development** delivering all covid-19 return to play, coach education courses, supporting club development, league manager stystem, TTW national competitions delivery.
- Safeguarding support- support for clubs/leagues, My Concern Platform, DBS, case management.
- **Membership support and communications-** promote the game and ensure everyone is affiliated and receiving their benefits- e.g. personal accident insurance.
- **Swansea development-** regional academy, club support, delivery with the university (we would like to replicate this partnership role in other areas of Wales when funding allows.

### **Staffing**

- Matthew Porter joined us as Swansea Development Officer in October 2020 and Mathew Davis joined us between October 2020 and August 2021 as the Business Support
- The recruitment to the Cardiff Participation Officer was paused because of the effect of the pandemic on delivery and more recently the issues around our funding and recruiting new staff.

### **Coach education and development**

- No coach education courses were run across the UK during this period however we plan to run 4 x Level 1 courses and 2 x Level 2 courses over 24 months.
- Both Stephen Jenkins and Matt Porter are studying for their Masters in elite sports coaching at UCLAN which includes the Level 4 award which is the highest coaching qualification.
- Josh Morgan has started his UKCC Level 3 qualification.
- Partnered with Cardiff Met University to deliver a new and improved Aspire to Coach development programme and we had representation at ITTF and ETTU Coaches Webinars
- Engaged with the Sport Wales Coach to Mentor programme.


- Worked with our HR partner to update staff contracts and Human Resource policies in line with legislation and best practice
- Provided staff health and well-being support in an employee assistance programme







- **Covid Guidelines** Supported clubs moving from alert level 4 down to level 0-Coacha booking system pilot.
- Membership A new structure was developed and introduced 2021/2022.
- Club Accreditation –introduced this season to help support club growth, ensure safety and wellbeing of participants and gives clubs a standard in which they can operate in a safely
- Be Active Wales Funding more than 6 clubs successfully apply for BAWF
- TT On The Go Project Partnered with 14 organisations and over 700 table tennis packs went out across Wales to clubs, communities, schools, families and housing associations.
- TT Leagues We have invested in TT Leagues for 2 years to help support leagues in their organisation, admin and league systems. Giving clubs more opportunities to promote their clubs helps table tennis in Wales to be more visible with leagues being easier to access results and opportunities.
- Bronze Insport standard- TTW proud to achieve this to show how inclusive we are as an organisation.





### **GAP Launch**

- GAP or Game Advisory Panel was launched in August 2021 as a key initiative
  to give Clubs and communities a voice and to expand the game nationally.
  We want to connect with key clubs and organisations within and outside of
  the sport. Ideally our aim is to see more people involved and giving back to
  the sport we all love while also appreciating the benefits of being part of the
  wider Table Tennis Wales network.
- League Management Committee –4 meetings held with the league management and have created more talking points, encouraging conversations are taking place to ensure growth and development in leagues and the structure of leagues and how they operate.
- Regional Forums Regional forums and a National Conference to engage with more people, bringing people together and share ideas and developments that are going on.
- **Competitions** new National Competitions Officer and committee members appointed. Brought back Team Championships of Wales 2021 (24 teams competing). We now turn our focus to Cardiff GP and other ranking events.






### **Swansea Regional Community/University**

- TTW partnered with Swansea City Football club to provide academy players with a table tennis engagement, wellbeing session.
- Recruited volunteers with Cardiff Met and University of South Wales to provide events and photography services.


### **Comms Overview**



### Safeguarding Report

- Dave Loosmore, National Safeguarding Officer (NSO) was unable to visit clubs in person as planned due to Covid-related restrictions. This will be a focus this season.
- Focused on club webinars and email communications to raise awareness of the topic
- Re-visited our policies and procedures to update in line with legislation and with feedback from TTW core team on operational procedures.
- Adopted case/concern management software called My Concern. Historical cases have been uploaded.
- Our NSO has achieved accreditation as a UK Coaching online Safeguarding and Protecting Children tutor, as well as an Associate Tutor for the Ann Craft Trust, delivering their Safeguarding Adults training.
- A joint Safeguarding and Protecting Children and Time to Listen course was developed, which will allow Club and League Safeguarding Officers to become compliant in one course. This was piloted during the summer and will be rolled out.
- Our NSO passed the NCFE accredited Lead Safeguarding Officer in Sport course.


