



Participation Growth

Our commitment to making table tennis a sport for all is at the heart of our strategy. This year has seen significant strides in expanding our reach, introducing more individuals to the joys and benefits of the game, and fostering a thriving community spirit across Wales.

Community Engagement

Successful initiatives targeted at bringing table tennis into local communities, fostering new clubs and increasing membership across all age groups.

Schools Programme

Introduction of new programmes in schools, significantly boosting junior participation and identifying emerging talent at an early stage.

Inclusive Opportunities

Development and expansion of programmes tailored for individuals of all abilities, ensuring table tennis is truly accessible to everyone.



Participation Growth

Regional officers have been pivotal in driving grassroots engagement, organising local tournaments, taster sessions, and establishing new clubs. This growth was significantly supported by the Be Active Wales Fund, which awarded over £50,000 in grants for club development and coaching qualifications, expanding our reach and impact.

Officer Impact & Community Engagement

Our regional officers conducted over 130 outreach events, including volunteer training, taster sessions and food & fun. This led to the formation of new clubs and the revitalisation of existing ones, ensuring broader access to table tennis across Wales.

Strategic Investment & Grant Outcomes

The Sport Wales Be Active Wales Fund invested £26,855 into equipment, advanced coaching for 30 new coaches, and inclusive programmes. This directly resulted in an increase in junior participation.

Future Goals & Sustainable Growth

We plan to extend our schools programme to additional primary schools and establish regional development hubs. Our aim is to increase overall membership by another 15% next year through digital platforms and community challenges, fostering a lifelong love for the sport.





Membership, Clubs, and Leagues Growth



Growth Trends (2023-2025)


Members Growth



TTW Competitions

The sustained increase in membership and club formation has directly fueled the expansion of our competitive calendar. Our focus has been on providing structured and accessible opportunities for players of all ages and abilities, resulting in notable growth across all competition tiers from 2023 to 2025.

Growth in Competitive Events (2023-2025)



The chart demonstrates consistent annual increases across all competition categories, mirroring the overall growth in participation. Regional Tournaments remain the backbone of our competitive structure, providing frequent local opportunities, while the significant rise in Youth and School Competitions underscores the success of our grassroots engagement strategies.



TTW's competitive calendar is designed to foster talent development from the beginner level (School Competitions) through to the elite level (National Championships). This tiered structure ensures a clear pathway for athletes and maximises competitive engagement across the community.

Key Success Factor: Ensuring high-quality officiating and accessible venue standards for all officially sanctioned TTW events.

Performance Pathway & Coaching Structure Update

Table Tennis Wales has restructured its performance pathway team. Effective October 18, the new interim Head of Performance Pathway is **Nathan Thomas**. Nathan brings advanced coaching qualifications and a strong track record focusing on modern training methodologies and individualized athlete programs.

Competitions

Players show commitment through participation in national and international events. Recent highlights include several players reaching quarterfinals in European youth events and consistent top-tier performances in national championships.

The coaching team includes Callum Evans, Cerys Evans, Aaron Beech, Sally Yeh, David Webber, Sam Slater, and Lloyd Gregory. Their collective expertise ensures a holistic approach to athlete growth.

Athlete Monitoring System (AMS)

Launching in August/September 2025, the **Athlete Monitoring System (AMS)** will centralize performance data, allowing players and coaches to log results, track training, and monitor feedback for real-time insights and dynamic training adjustments.



Home Nations Veterans Championship Success

Table Tennis Wales proudly announces outstanding success at the recent Home Nations Table Tennis Championships held at Nottingham Trent University. Our dedicated Wales Veterans team delivered exceptional performances across multiple categories, securing a remarkable haul of medals and demonstrating the enduring talent and commitment within our veteran ranks. These achievements underscore the depth of experience and competitive spirit present in Welsh table tennis, bringing significant recognition to our national program.

Individual Medal Winners

The individual events saw fierce competition, with several Welsh athletes battling their way to the podium:

- Lesley Keast Silver, Over 60s Ladies Singles. Lesley showcased incredible tenacity throughout the tournament, navigating a challenging draw to reach a well-deserved final. Her strategic play and consistent form were a highlight.
- Bhanureka Sabaratnam Bronze, Over 40s Ladies Singles.
- **Cath Jones Bronze**, Over 40s Ladies Singles. The strong showing by both Bhanureka and Cath in this highly competitive category highlights the formidable presence of Welsh women in veteran table tennis.
- **Gavin Jones Bronze**, Over 40s Men's Singles. Gavin's powerful attacks and controlled defense proved a winning combination, securing him a place among the top players.
- **John Hook & Jeff Rigby Silver**, Over 60s Men's Doubles. A fantastic partnership that saw them overcome several strong pairings with excellent teamwork and tactical awareness.
- Cath Jones & Delyth North Silver, Over 40s Ladies Doubles. This duo demonstrated brilliant communication and seamless coordination, earning them a commendable silver.
- **Lesley Keast & Jane Reeks Silver**, Over 60s Ladies Doubles. Another impressive silver for Lesley, partnering with Jane to form a resilient and effective doubles team.

Team Success

Our teams also excelled, demonstrating collective strength and spirit:

- Over 60s Men's Team Silver. A testament to their consistent performance and deep understanding of team dynamics, securing a top-tier finish.
- Over 40s Ladies Team (Wales A) Bronze. This team displayed exceptional cohesion and fought valiantly through tough matches to claim their bronze medal.
- Over 75s Team Bronze. The enduring skill and passion of our most experienced players shone through, proving that age is truly just a number.



These results are a direct reflection of the rigorous preparation and unwavering commitment of our veteran athletes. Many dedicated countless hours to training sessions, focusing on physical conditioning, technical refinement, and strategic game planning. The camaraderie and mutual support within the squad also played a crucial role, creating a positive and competitive environment conducive to success. Coaches worked closely with individuals and teams to fine-tune their skills and mental approach, ensuring they were well-prepared for the intensity of the championships.

The success at the Home Nations Veterans Championship reinforces the importance of a strong veterans program and inspires further investment in coaching and development opportunities. Future plans include expanding training camps, increasing participation in international veterans events, and fostering a new generation of veteran players to ensure continued success and enjoyment of table tennis for years to come.

Coaching Qualifications

Level 1 coaches and Level 2 coaches **have** increased. A new agreement with Table Tennis England enables course delivery in Wales.



Safeguarding Excellence

Building on CPSU Level 2 achievement, we are working towards Level 3. The MyVoice app and monthly courses ensure safe environments.



Staff Training

We developed a structured staff training system with Cobalt **HR**.

In 2025, a new Table Tennis Wales Activators course was launched, supporting school teachers, young leaders, and club volunteers with engaging techniques for youth participation.

Making Our Sport Safe

In 2024–25, Table Tennis Wales (TTW) significantly strengthened its member protection efforts. We introduced the **MyVoice system** for anonymous reporting, updated all safety policies, and ensured every club agreed to these new rules. We provided free training and thorough background checks (DBS) for all Club Safeguarding Officers (SGOs). While serious concerns remain rare, we've observed an increase in non-compliance with behavioral guidelines, which TTW is actively addressing. We are committed to achieving **CPSU Level 3 certification** by April 2026, demonstrating our dedication to the highest safety standards.

Safeguarding Progress & Key Achievements

- Appointed and trained a Deputy Safeguarding Lead.
- Reviewed and updated all safety policies and Codes of Conduct, requiring mandatory agreement from all members, clubs, leagues, and SGOs for 2025–26.
- Established a forum for Safeguarding Officers to share best practices.
- Confirmed all clubs and SGOs possess current DBS checks and training.
- Supported CPSU's "Keeping Your Child Safe in Sport" Week and regularly updated our governance calendar.

Challenges & Future Improvements

- Improving parent and club participation remains a challenge; we plan to expand the Parents' Forum and create a new forum for young members.
- Seeking further guidance and support to achieve CPSU Level 3 certification.
- Addressing low attendance at training sessions through earlier advertising and better coordination to prevent duplicate training and increase cost-effectiveness.

Comprehensive Safety Training Plan (2025-26)

Our goal is to ensure all TTW personnel—board members, staff, coaches, and SGOs—receive appropriate safety training aligned with national standards.

- Targeted Training: Board members complete CPSU/ACT training; all paid staff receive child and adult protection training (adult training by Ann Craft Trust); Club SGOs complete Level 1 UK Coaching Safeguarding Training and enhanced DBS checks; all coaches working with TTW complete UK Coaching safety training.
- **Delivery:** We will utilize internal quarterly sessions, in-house trainers, and online modules meeting UK Coaching, Ann Craft Trust, or bespoke TTW standards.

Governance & Policy Development

We have drafted child-friendly safety policies and a minor concerns policy for feedback. Our equality, diversity, and inclusion (ED&I) policy is now integrated into our safety framework, and TTW's core values are under review to align with our updated strategy.



These relationships support inclusive sessions, regional development centres, and high-quality competitive events.



Expense Performance



Income: Overall income for 2024/2025 increased due to growth in grants and commercial activities.

Expenses: Overall expenses for 2024/2025 were reduced, reflecting improved operational efficiencies.

Reserves: The organisation retains self-generated funds as working capital to manage financial risks and facilitate future reinvestment in our sport. These retained funds are held as cash in interest-bearing bank accounts, ensuring their availability at short notice with no risk to capital.

Collaborative Engagement: We continued to engage with Sport Wales to explore enhanced collaboration within the sports sector, aiming to build financial resilience through effective and efficient operational strategies.
